The role of policies. Rural areas policy-makers are aware that the absence of sustainable mobility schemes affects any development strategy implemented in rural territories. No matter how much effort is spent on education, promotion of tourism, development of new economic initiatives, etc.: sustainable transport pattern (from the environmental, social and economic perspectives) is one of the key to success for development initiative. Decision makers from mountain and rural areas acknowledge the role they must play and are ready to take action.

The overall objective of the project. Move on Green will improve the design and effectiveness of regional policies on sustainable transport in rural and mountain areas. To do so, the project will organize exchanges of experiences on sustainable mobility.
