COMMON MODEL

- WHAT? a sort of "manual" giving guidance and creating a framework for sustainable development processes across the SEE area.
- HOW IT WORKS? It describes a process that, starting with a survey of the area concerned, leads to a development process resulting in several activities that finally influence the situation of the local population positively.



8 MANAGEMENT PLANS

- WHAT? Operative plans for an integrated and coordinated management of sensitive mountain areas through a multi-actor and multi-sector approach.
- The Management Plans were drawn up by each concerned project partner on the basis of indications and strategies developed in the Common Model.
- Specific activities and actions were tailored by each partner in respect to its territory's specific resources, needs and assets.
