





Carta delle Foreste di Lombardia

In 2004 it signed with all of the Municipalities and the partners, a Regional Forests Charta

It identifies 10 principles of sustainable management

The contract binds signatories to respect and work towards the achievement of 16 commitments



Within the 16 commitments, there is "Forest's Contract", which is an agreement signed for each forest with the subjects interested in building a permanent place of confrontation, elaboration, promotion and implementation of actions aimed at the local development.


An agreement between public and private entities for the development of the territory of the Regional Forest and the surrounding area

- ➤ **Policy**: integration of the various policies










Circularity of processes and flows
